Sanctions and Rewards at Bright Education Centre:

The rules at Bright Education Centre are simple. However, if you choose to ignore them there will be swift consequences. None of the staff will allow rude or disruptive behaviour in the centre. If you fail to meet these expectations you will be removed from the classroom and made to work in silence in the quit area. You will also sit a detention at the end of that day. Your tutors will also expect your work to be completed on time, you must have correct equipment's always. Not following the instructions set could result in either a detention or the possibility of an exclusion. To make it clear, here is a list of things **you must not do** if you are to avoid detention our exclusion.

If you bring a mobile phone to the centre, it must be handed in to the reception. If a phone is heard, seen or fond on a pupil it will be confiscated for 3 days and one-hour detention will be automatically set.

What happens if I keep getting a detention?

Students will gain a negative point for every detention they receive. The accumulation of 15 or more NP will lead to a 90min Saturday detention for those students who accumulate more than 30 NP will face fixed term exclusion.

In addition to detentions, students may be internally excluded. This is when they are required to work in silence in the Quit Area. This will happen if you come to centre wearing the wrong uniform and we cannot get hold of your parents to send you home to change or if you have been involved in an incident. If you are involved in a very serious incident, you may have to spend more than one day in the QA. Whenever a pupil spends a day or more in QA, their parents will always be contacted.

In very serious circumstances, the director may decide to exclude a pupil from Centre. This will mean they have to work at home until they return to centre with their parents for a meeting.

BULLYING



We do not tolerate bullying at Bright Education Centre, but we cannot do anything to stop it if we do not know about it. If you are being bullied, that is, if you are being hurt in some way (not just physically) by someone else who won't stop, then you must tell a member of staff about it.

Sometimes bullies genuinely think they are just 'having a bit of fun' with their victims. They only need to be told by someone else that it isn't funny and they stop. Sometimes this isn't the case and stronger measures have to be used. Whatever the circumstances, bullying can never be dealt with unless you tell us all about it, either directly or by having your parents tell us. Similarly, if you know that someone is suffering at the hands of a bully you must come forward and tell a member of staff that it is happening.

We do not want anyone to fear coming to Centre or going to lessons. However, we can only stop bullying if you speak out and tell us when it is happening. Don't just stand by and let it happen, come forward and speak to a member of staff you trust.

When you want to report bullying you can speak to a teacher you trust, such as your Form Tutor. Don't forget that you can report bullying even if you are not the victim. If you see someone suffering, then speak to them and then to a teacher or. They may be feeling scared and need your support. If you would like to report bullying anonymously (without giving your name) you can use the anti-bullying box at the centre.

We will also train some of you to be peer mentors. They will learn how to help students who are unhappy about the way other pupils are treating them and provide them with moral support and guidance when necessary.
